Turnaround is just reward for hard work



WHAT a fantastic achievement by our first grade team by reaching the club's first ever first grade grand final.

An amazing turnaround after our first six games to eventually reach the pinnacle of the season at the WACA. Whilst Joondalup proved too strong for us, we did the club proud by their season's achievements.

This has topped a tremendous year for the Club, where the playing group have now gained sufficient experience and games played in the competition to show the opposing Club's that Gosnells Cricket Club are now a force.

The First Grade season hit full swing after the mid year break. The team was clearly one of the better performed sides in the second half of the year, losing only once to Melville.

Impressive, consecutive outright victories against Bayswater Morley and Subiaco Floreat gave the team tremendous momentum coming into the business end of the year, and in fact, the boys almost pulled off what would have been a WACA District first if they completed a third outright in a row against Wanneroo.

The season finished with the ones sitting in sixth position with two outrights and six first innings wins.

There have been some outstanding performers in the First Grade group, led by Luis Reece. Luis scored 422 runs at 32.46 to win the batting aggregate. Darcy Short finished with a real flurry with 475 runs at 31.67 and Alastair Bivens 416 runs at 29.71.

Of course Darcy also smashed a blistering 109 against Joondalup in the Elimination Final. Luis led the way with the ball as well, taking a new Club Record 56 wickets for the season at

He also broke the most wickets in an innings by taking 14/108 against Wanneroo. Matt Hanna again had a very productive year with 35 wickets at 15.91, and Brett Bayley his best year at the Club with 28 wickets at 19.82.

Another record breaker was Ryan James-Buckley who completed 40 dismissals for the year as the Wicket Keeper.

A pleasing aspect of the year was that we had 7 players debut in the Baggy Blue. Congratulations to Luis Reece, David Roberts, Cameron Heron, Brandon Jacobs, Daniel Payne, Craig Fulford and Simon Acomb.

The Second Grade had a tough year, and were hindered by a long term injury to their skipper Danny Neretlis. They did manage a great outright against Wanneroo, and 2 other wins for the year to finish 14th. The Batting was led by Craig Fulford with 405 runs at 33.75 (and 1 century), closely followed by Daniel Payne 315 runs at 26.25 and Jordan Armstrong 354 runs at 19.67. Cameron Heron has had another outstanding season with the ball that saw him earn First Grade selection this year. His 29 wickets at 17.97 good enough to get him the Bowling Award. Rao Zafer 16 wickets at 24.44 and Ben Horsman 12 wickets at 30.83 good

The Third Grade again had a terrific season, and for the second year in a row, missed finals by the narrowest of margins. This year their 1 win outright, 8 first innings wins and a draw saw them finish 7th, 2 points from finals. Craig Jensen returned in the second part of the year to give the team real momentum with his 241 runs at 48.20 (and 1 century). Alistair Turner with 225 runs at 37.50 and Sidney Menezes 223 runs at 22.30 also good contributors. Jarrad King led the way with the ball with 24 wickets at 18.33, and he was ably assisted by Liam O'Neill 15 wickets at 14 and Simon Acomb 13 wickets at 9 08

The Fourth Grade had a fighting year, and although they did not finish in the finals, showed plenty of spirit and fight. They had 4 wins and a draw to finish 14th. Shawn Southam had a great year with 274 runs at 54.80, and Brennan Bachman 306 runs at 23.54 and Tom Newman 212 runs at 21.20 solid contributors. The bowling was all English import James Mead, with 28 wickets at 18. Brennan Bachman took 14 at 19.21 and Simon Acomb 13 at 18.77.

As this is the year's last Cover Drive, I would like to thank the Coaching Group and Selection Committee for an outstanding year. I am happy to say that Brendan Bracewell, Danny Neretlis, Andrew Panetta, Wayne Clark and Peter Agostino have committed to Coaching again next year. The Selectors, Brendan Bracewell, Danny Neretlis, Ray Horsman, Andrew Panetta and I will also continue.

A Thanks also to this year's Captain's. Darcy Short has obviously done a magnificent job to lead his side deep into the finals. Danny Neretlis came back late, but in his absence Alastair Turner and Ben Horsman did a fine job. Andrew Panetta again led the three's to the brink of final's, and in his absence through injury, Josh Bailey took the reigns with great effect. Brennan Bachman in the fours showed great leadership skills, and he bought to the group a fierce desire to compete.

Congratulations to Michael Bailey and Darcy Short who led the WA Indigenous boys to back to back titles. Michael also captained both years, and to Michael for his Scorchers contract. To the three boys, Darcy, Michael and Alistair Bivens who also represented the WA Indigenous team in Darwin at the start of the year. To Luis Reece who took out the Hawk Medal, congratulations. And to all the winners of the awards at our presentation dinner, well

Whatever the final outcome of this year, this Club, it's players and Coaches, and it's members can now build on some hard work that has been going on for a few seasons now. There is a belief, and I expect, that there will be more sides from Gosnells participating in finals next year. We cannot however accept this year as a benchmark. Losing just one game from this point was a dominant performance in the states premier cricket competition.

The Grand Final presented the biggest challenge of all with competition powerhouse Joondalup proving to be the benchmark all season and too strong for our boys.

We continued throughout the day working hard in the field to see a number of catches just fall out of reach of our fieldsmen and our bowlers finding it difficult to hit their areas on a very good WACA batting wicket. Their was little margin for error as two very classy young batsmen in Inglis and Hinchcliffe took full advantage of anything that strayed.

Posting 6/557 off their 112 overs left our boys with a massive total to chase off just 85 overs. Needing just under a run a ball, proved way out of reach. Matthew Leipold was the best of the Hawks batsmen finishing the innings on 58 not out.







Great effort on reaching the grand final and it is assured that the experience is one that will stand our group in good stead for the coming seasons but a season that has instilled belief in the ability of our players to match it with the best in the competition.

LUIS Reece nearly capped off a sensational summer falling just three votes short of taking out the WACA's best player in the first grade competition.

The Olly Cooley Medal is voted on a 3-2-1 basis by the umpires after each game for the best players.

Scarborough's Justin Coetzee and Luis were level pegging going into the last round of fixtures with Coetzee having a great game and picking up the maximum three votes to finish on 22 votes.

Unfortunately Luis had to return to England for Lancashire's pre season tour and was unable to play in the last fixture. This not being the case, the form that he was in could well have seen him poll maximum points in the last game.

Regardless of this, his season was one that was instrumental in helping the club to its first finals appearance for 21 years which ultimately saw the boys advance to the grand final on the back of strong wins in the elimination and qualifying finals.

Luis completed his memorable season by taking out the John Marsh Memorial Trophy for the Senior Cricketer of Year, the Gil McDonald Award for One Day Cricketer of Year, made 422 runs at 32.46, took 56 wickets at 12.04, made 113 against Scarborough in round six, broke the club record for most wickets in a match taking 14/108 against Wanneroo in round 14, 7/47 against Subiaco Floreat and 7/29 against Bayswater Morley.

If all goes to plan, the club is hoping for a Luis Reece return next season and hope that Lancashire see the talent within and provide Luis with the opportunities he deserves.


I would also like to thank our coaches for all the work they done with the squads. Last of all I would like to thank the players and their parents for all their hard work that they have done over the seasons.




