



Frustrating season but plenty to work on

THE game against Claremont Nedlands signalled the end of the season for Gosnells Cricket Club. In a season that promised a lot, and with huge expectations, it was a season of frustration marred by injury to key players at inopportune times. Our first grade in fact rarely looked like the Grand Final side of last year.

The First Grade finished a commendable 10th when consideration is made of the issues that confronted the Club this year. With 6 wins and two draws, a couple of bad losses where we failed to chase down very modest totals was pivotal to us missing finals.

Even in Round 14, with an outright over Fremantle and a win against Claremont Nedlands, we would have snuck into finals again. A better effort against Claremont Nedlands would have seen us finish 7th.

But the season was derailed by the loss of Matthew Leipold prior to Round 1, Luis Reece injury which prevented him from bowling from Round 9, and subsequently leaving early after Christmas and the loss of Matt Hanna for the rest of the year following an injury in our last T20 fixture.

This translated into the ones losing a trio that took in excess of 100 wickets last year, a savage blow. But with setback comes opportunity, and we again blooded some of our very talented young cricketers.

Tim Hale and new recruit Aaron Onyon wore the baggy blue from Round 1. Jordan Armstrong and Jaxom Rose also earnt their baggy blue with excellent form in the twos, and Jeremy McFarlane rounded out our 5 debutants with a couple of first grade games at the end of the year.

Congratulations to the major contributors this year, Aaron Onyon with 391 runs at 39.10 and 16 wickets at 34.56 was an

outstanding pick up for this cricket club. Luke Pomersbach had a strong second half of the year and finished with 361 runs at 25.79 and one century, and the work horse Brett Bayley had his break out season with 34 wickets at 20.03

The Second Grade were fantastic this year, and their 8th (7 wins 2 draws) spot finish would be the highest they have finished for some time.

Early in the season the ability to still win games even though the team was constantly being disrupted with selection due to injury showed how resilient the team was and the great cohesion and morale they had within the squad.

Up until the last Round, they were still a chance to make finals. But the injury toll in the ones did catch up with them and had an impact in the second half of the year. Congratulations to Jordan Armstrong on his debut in the ones and a fantastic year with the bat with 374 runs at 46.75. He was supported by Brandon Jacobs with 317 runs at 22.64. Jeremy McFarlane led the wicket takers with 27 at 14.30, and also made his first grade debut. Cameron Heron again was a wicket taker with 25 at 30.28.

The Threes finished 15th (3 wins 3 draws) and it was a year of missed opportunity. In games they played very well in they just fall short of victory, missing out on two occasions by less than a handful of runs.

They also were in very strong positions in two washed out draws that they would have expected to win. Luke McNamee shone with the bat with 264 runs at 37.71, and Derek Bland and Christian Agostino were also strong contributors both with 183 runs at 22.88.

Jacob Horsman, from only 7 games, was the standout bowler with 14 wickets at

14.57. Suhail Parker also took 14 wickets at 25.07.

The Fourth Grade have really built a very competitive nature under Brennan Bachman and there effort this year has been fantastic.

Finishing 14th was not a true reflection on their season with the side in strong positions in washed out games and being able to chase big totals and not be bowled out showed strong character even though they did not get the target.

Jacob Sands was a standout with 281 runs at 41 including 2 centuries, the skipper Brennan Bachman also with 323 runs at 26.92 and one century great support. Brian Lutter was the pick of the bowlers with 13 wickets at 32.23 and a very promising 17 year old Travis Rodin-Zimdahl with 9 wickets at 11.89.

Congratulations to all trophy winners including Cricketers of the Year and Hawk Medallist Brett Bayley.

A thank you to our Captains for this year, Darcy Short in the ones, Baden Norwood in the twos, Luke Marshall in the threes and Brennan Bachman in the fours.

Thanks also to all of the Coaches, particularly Danny Neretlis who had a very tough first year with the injuries and issues that presented. The Selectors again did a fantastic job in getting balanced teams out each week despite growing injury tolls, and the focus on development of our young cricketers saw 8 Under 17s experience Senior Cricket this year, with Blake McGann, Travis Rodin-Zimdahl and Ashal Wahid adapting very well to the task.

Work for next season has started and the challenge to get back to finals is a clear focus. A unified approach and willingness to play your part, do your role first beyond all else and work towards a Club Championship that will go a long way to this cricket club achieving its goals.

We served up a feed and had plenty of refreshments keep the sponsors happy.








Country links continue


