

### 2021-22 HAWK MEDAL AQEEL WAHID



At the conclusion of the 2021-22 season, we once again celebrated the performances of several individuals with the Hawk Medal count, which this year was topped by First Grade all-rounder Aqeel Wahid.

'Shaq' was a remarkable point of consistency in the Ones side this year despite their lack of results, and became one of the leaders on the field this year for the young club, culminating in his first Hawk Medal win.

His most notable achievement came in R13 against Midland Guildford, where he compiled a personal-best of 60\* from 80 balls to finish off a One-Day innings at Midland-Guildford for his maiden First Grade fifty. He also performed well against Willetton capturing 1/19 from 10 overs before making 42 in the chase, and against University where he captured 3/78 from 26 overs in-between two innings making 45 runs in the match, finishing not out in the second dig.





After another mad finish to our cricketing season in 2021-22, due in part to COVID again followed with a well-earned winter break. Since then, our boys have all returned refreshed and refocused for the pre-season and season ahead.

We started the pre-season with our returningn Strength & Conditioning Manager Mitch Coles conducting a number of fitness testing exercises on a Sunday morning in July. As we have seen over our journey so far, the importance of having a high fitness base plays a huge role in injury prevention. This enables all our players to do what they love best, playing the game without spending time on the sideline attending to their rehabilitation. The following Tuesday from this was the official commencement of our pre-season skills focus inside our first class Indoor Training Facility at Sutherlands Park.

The players were required within a 6-week period to develop and prepare their necessary and comfortable skills and routines in readiness for game specific scenarios they would be facing in September ahead of the season starting. This was an important period for individuals to discover and cement their routines prior to the next stage of the pre-season program.

As with all development phases in a cricketer's life there is continual tweaking of individual routines and game plans, and this period provided the players with an opportunity in exploring new practices along with achieving them. We are currently, at the time of printing, in the final phase of our preseason with our direction now on game development and preparation for the first Saturday in October, when round 1 and the 2022-23 campaign kicks off.

I would like to commend the coaches and the playing group on taking up the challenges that have been put in front of them. I am confident we are now in a better position than last season in understanding everyone's own individual strengths, which all bodes well for the season ahead. We certainly have many more obstacles to overcome but I look forward with extreme optimism for what lies ahead for this talented group of men.

I would also like to take this opportunity to also thank all coaches and players for continuing to communicate with myself regarding notification of late work commitments, holidays, the ever-present issues surrounding the way we deal with our health, in particular Covid, and with finding ways to just get better at getting better. Remember its *your* career, *your* responsibility to manage *your* cricket and life. I would like to think we are making a difference in this area.

As I look forward to the season ahead, I would also like to thank and wish our sponsors, the City of Gosnells, our curators, the GCC Board, our players, our volunteers and parents another wonderful summer of cricket ahead.
