

Inspirational Liam pads up

AFTER sitting down and chatting with Liam Collis along with club secretary Melissa Heron, it confirmed what I already knew about a very special young man who proudly wears the Mighty Hawks colours.

I first saw Liam bowl up close when he played 3rd grade whilst still playing juniors. He had a fantastic action similar to one of Australia's great bowlers. He had been given the nickname of "Pigeon", after the great Glenn McGrath. Standing at first slip I could see that this was a very appropriate nickname. I became very excited very quickly at the thought of Liam one day opening the bowling for our 1st grade team.

Liam was last year dealt a nasty card, one that any fit young healthy young man should not be dealt. Life has for a long time been known to throw up nasty surprises that test the character and fight in us human beings. How could this talented young man be the unlucky one to have to face this test so early in life. It's just not fair.

Massive growth

When Liam started feeling very ill constantly and short of breath, it was the signal being sent to him that something was drastically wrong. After visiting the doctors, scans revealed a massive growth, nearly the size of a football on the left hand side of his chest. The worst possible diagnosis was realised, he had Hodgkins Lymphoma.

This was to test the character and fight in Liam, a fight he was ready to tackle head on. With 12 sessions of Chemotherapy over six months delivered through a port inserted into his chest and 18 sessions of Radiotherapy, this was enough to sap every ounce of energy from Liam's body. Each Chemotherapy session lasted for two and a half hours with 4 separate injections.

After each session of Chemo, it would take up to five days to gradually get back to feeling in some way well. Nauseous and very weak with very little energy whilst also being very sensitive to the sun.

During all this, Liam's family were the rock

that supported him through thick and thin, mum Claire, dad Evan, sisters Tara and Siobhan, all lived Liam's agonising pain. His popularity amongst his friends and those of us at the Gosnells Cricket Club were well and truly realised during this tough time.

Then came the long road back to full strength. Liam swapped the hospital bed and joined a program that Steve Smith ran called the Chemo Club which assisted people like Liam that have endured the cancer treatment chemotherapy to exercise and work their way back to full fitness. Such was Liam's commitment and determination, he went there every moment he could.

He attended a couple of Warriors training sessions, started having constant hits in his back yard cricket nets. He has found getting back into bowling after having a season off has been a lot harder than batting so he has spent a lot of time working on his batting.

One thing he set his sights on was getting back into the whites, donning the pads and walking out into the middle once again for Gosnells. This became a reality when he padded up for the third grade in the first game but unfortunately rain interrupted when Liam was at the crease.

Liam said that remaining positive and in high spirits were important in his recovery stage. Focussing on the important things in life, appreciate life and the things that really matter.

Liam starts at UWA in March and is studying Exercise and Health Science. One thing for sure is that whilst Liam still has some challenges ahead, his character and fight will stand him in good stead to make every post a winner.

Great to have you back around the club Liam and we are all so very proud of you and hope you receive the required good news in six weeks time when you have your next check up.

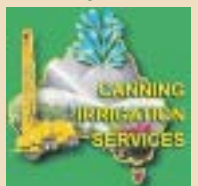

This is a fantastic achievement which has seen limited success of our top grades but has seen premierships in fourth grade and the colts competition. Olly Cooley Medallists, State representatives and some outstanding individuals in both administration, coaching and playing.

Playings stocks will be strengthened by the recruitment of Northern Territorian Matt Hanna, a member of the Team of the Carnival in last seasons National 19s Carnival held in Adelaide for being the leading wickettaker. In my opinion, this structure is unsurpassed by any of the clubs in the competition, and means every player at any time can seek assistance from our Coaching group.

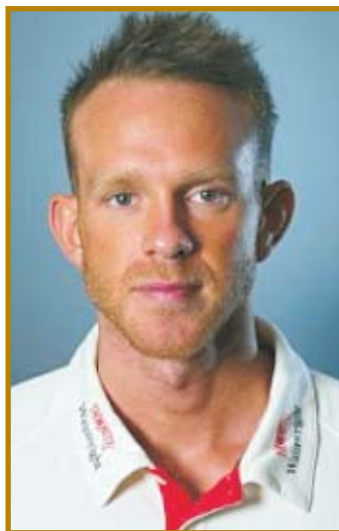
Selections will also be a little different this year. The selectors will be myself as the chairman, Mark Hughes and Russell Ledain. The captains will also provide feedback into selections as well.

Through the management and scheduling of our training program it is my "one job" to try and ensure that our players have trained all the physical and mental skills necessary to go into the season confident, motivated and in a position to perform at their best. And for me, and for every player, this all comes down to preparation.

It would come as no surprise to anyone to know that I am a huge "preparer". After all, hundreds of cones don't just fall onto the oval every Tuesday and Thursday.
